No tuition will be credited or refunded for cancellations made within 24 hours prior to the start of the class.

Cancelled Classes

This program is a non-profit organization and relies on tuition fees to run. If classes are cancelled due to low enrollment or unforeseen reasons, you will be notified and receive a full refund by mail or an option to attend another class.

Full Classes

Once a class is filled, registration will be closed for that class. Your name will be placed on a wait-list. If there is a cancellation, you will be notified.



Nurse

There is no nurse on staff during the course of the program.

Full-Day Courses

Full day courses run from 8:45am until 11:45am. Students may register for one full day course.

Half-Day Courses

Half-day courses run from 8:45am until 10:15am or from 10:20am until 11:50am. Students may register for one half-day course or combine two courses for a customized full-day experience.

Method of Payment – Payment must be made through Pay-For It at the time of registration.

On-Line Registration – Registration will open on March 4, 2019. Enrollment is limited, and courses will close when filled.

Registration Deadline – All registration and payments must be received no later than May 1, 2019. Registrations received after May 1, 2019 may be accepted based on availability.

Confirmation – You will not receive confirmation of your registration. A detailed email will be sent out just prior to the start date.

Insurance – Participants are responsible for their own insurance. In the event of an injury that occurs while participating in our program, the Manalapan-Englishtown Regional School District will assume no liability.

Mathematics Instruction

Small Group Mathematics for Students Entering Grades 1 – 8

This small group math program is designed to help elementary to middle school students acquire grade level math skills in an enjoyable, supportive, informal setting of no more than ten students. The program runs for five weeks and provides 30 hours of differentiated instruction featuring games, explorations, hands-on activity, and partner practice.

Pre- Algebra and Intro. to Geometry for Students Entering Grades 5 - 8

This Pre-Algebra/Geometry introductory class is open to all entering 5-8th graders. The foundation for higher-level mathematics will be laid with many of the concepts that will be introduced here. The course will begin with a brief review of the number system and operations with whole numbers, fractions, decimals, and positive and negative numbers. Rational and linear exponents, ratios and proportions, and simple to complex equations will be introduced. We will also begin to measure angles, prove geometric theorems, and discover how to calculate areas and volumes. The class will culminate with an overall project utilizing all concepts learned from the course.

Algebra 1 and Geometry for Students Entering Grades 6 - 8

This Algebra 1/Geometry readiness class is open to all entering 6-8th graders with experience in the subject matter. The class will start by reviewing major topics covered in Pre-Algebra. The class will then begin teaching the initial few lessons of the Algebra 1 curriculum. Emphasis will be placed on more creative assessments (projects) than tests/quizzes. Once a foundation of Algebra 1 is achieved, the class will move onto Geometry, specifically Euclidean geometry. The class will culminate with an overall project utilizing all concepts learned from the course.

Language Arts & Mathematics Combination Courses

Reading, Writing, and Math, Oh My! for Students Entering Grades 1, 2, & 3 or Grades 4, 5, & 6

Students will maintain and further develop their skills in word work, reading, writing, and math in this center-based community of learning. This program is designed to actively engage students throughout the morning. They will work collaboratively with peers, in small groups, and one-on-one with the teacher. Teachers will tap into the individual interests, strengths, and needs of each child.

Word Work – Strategy lessons will be taught to strengthen decoding and encoding skills

Students will have the opportunity daily to read texts of their interest as we learn how to utilize the library and deepen our love for literacy, all while having fun with an interactive and collaborative Makerspace program.
