### Reminders

**Drop-off** and **arrival** each day is at 8:10 AM; we encourage all students to take the bus.

In the event of a **delayed opening** due to inclement weather, drop-off and arrival would be delayed by 90minutes. In such an occasion, the school start time is at 9:40 AM.

If you are driving your child to school, please do not drop your child off earlier than 7:50 AM. **Drop-off is done in the "drop-off lane"** located at the front parking lot. For the safety of your child, please do not release your child until you see staff present.

**Dismissal for students taking the bus** is at 2:30 PM each day. If you are picking your child up and not having him/her take the bus home, then **parent pickup** is at 2:20 PM at the double glass doors at the rear of the school. A note must be sent in for the Main Office if you are picking your child up from school. In the event of a **4-hour day**, dismissal is at 12:10 PM. Parent pickup is at 12:00 PM.

Visitors to the School: School safety is of utmost priority. Any person looking to visit the school during school hours is required to provide advance notice via the Passage Point System. Visitors who register will be required to ring the front bell, state their first and last name and their purpose for visiting, show proper ID, and obtain a visitor pass which is to be worn throughout the entire approved visit. Unexpected persons will not be permitted entry to the building.

#### On the First Day of School:

Teachers wait outside their classroom to greet students and to take attendance.

Staff is outside to assist all students as they get off the bus. Students in grades K and 1 are exited first and guided to their classroom.

\*\*\*Please be reminded buses may run late for arrival and pickup during the first week of school.

## **Special Instruction**

Once every six days (per the six-day rotation), students receive instruction in art and music from our art and music specialists. Students in grades 1-5 receive instruction from the media specialist once every six days. Every other six-day rotation, 1-5 students receive instruction from the school counselor and on the alternating six-day rotation, students in grades 1-5 receive instruction in their classrooms with the technology teacher. Twice per six-day rotation, students receive physical education instruction from our physical education teachers. Sneakers are required to be worn during P.E. The physical education teachers will also send out a newsletter when school starts regarding safety and additional procedures and guidelines. Family Life instruction is built into the physical education teacher's program for students in grades 4 and 5.

Additionally, students receive **health** and **character education** lessons from their classroom teacher. The school counselor will also be instructing students on **character education/anti-bullying** concepts during her meetings with classes.

**Response to Intervention (RTI)** services are available to eligible students in reading and mathematics. If you have concerns regarding your child's academic progress or social, emotional, or behavioral well-being, please do not hesitate to contact the school principal for guidance and support.
