As in the past, students <u>are to wear their costumes to school</u>. However, students should NOT wear any costume-related masks, big shoes, or any other items that might obstruct their vision or ability to safely walk/board the buses. In addition, please do not send in toy weapons, such as swords or play guns as part of your child's costume.

PLEASE NOTE:

Please be advised that (even with costumes on), in-school students are required to wear face masks throughout the school day which are required as part of the reopening plan and the executive order for schools.

While we will not be able to celebrate with the traditional class parties conducted in the past, teachers will be encouraged to incorporate Halloween-related activities that adhere to social distancing regulations which ensure that the health and safety of our students is prioritized. In addition, all classrooms will be asked to take pictures of their students who can be photographed per the Media Release. We encourage parents of 100% virtual students to email us pictures as well. We will compile these photographs into a special presentation which we will share with you in early November.

Please also be advised that food items are never permitted to be distributed to students by staff or other students. Many of our students, in previous years, have enjoyed handing out goodie bags with non-edible items to their classmates; however, to ensure the health and safety of all persons due to current circumstances, such cannot be distributed at all this year. We hope to be able to encourage this practice again when regulations change.

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Reminders

Drop-off and arrival each day is normally 8:10AM. However, we are allowing parents to begin to line up in the parent drop –off lane at 8:00AM due to the number of parent drop-offs this year due to Covid-19.

Drop off is done in the "Drop-off lane" located in the front parking lot. For the safety of your child, please do not release him/her until you see staff present. In addition, please make sure your child is wearing a mask before he/she exits the car.

Dismissal for hybrid students taking the bus is at 12:10 PM each day. If you are picking your child up and not having him/her take the bus home, then parent pickup is at 12:00 PM at the gym door at the rear of the school. A note must be sent in for the Main Office if you are picking your child up from school.

Visitors to the School: School safety is of utmost priority. Any person looking to visit the school during school hours is required to provide advance notice via the Passage Point System. Visitors who register will be required to ring the front bell, state their first and last name and their purpose for visiting, and show proper ID. Please note due to Covid-19, we will not be allowing visitors in the building at this time. A staff member will bring your child outside to you if he/she needs to be released early.
