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Cancelled Classes

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MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTION

Small Group Mathematics for Students Entering Grades 1-8

*This class will be offered in person and/or virtual.

This small group mathematics class will be held for 90 minutes each day It is designed to help elementary to middle school students acquire grade level math skills in an enjoyable, supportive, informal setting of no more than 12 students. The program runs for 5 weeks and provides 29 hours of differentiated instruction over 19 days featuring online games, IXL, ST Math, small group instruction, explorations and more.

MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTION

Pre-Algebra and Introduction to Geometry for Students Entering Grades 5-8

This Pre-Algebra/Geometry Introductory class is open to all rising 5th-8th graders. The foundation for higher-level mathematics will be laid with many of the related concepts being introduced in this course. This course will begin with a brief review of the number system and operations with whole numbers, fractions, decimals, and positive and negative numbers. Rational and linear exponents, rations, and proportions, and simple to complex equations will be introduced. Students will also begin to measure angles, prove geometric theorems and discover how to calculate areas and volumes. The class will culminate with an overall project utilizing all concepts learned from the course.

MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTION

Algebra 1 and Geometry for Students Entering Grades 6-8

This Algebra 1/Geometry readiness class is open to all entering 6th-8th graders with experience in the subject matter. The class will start by reviewing major topics covered in Pre-Algebra. The class will then transition to the instruction of the initial lessons of the Algebra 1 curriculum. Emphasis will be placed on more creative assignments (projects). Once the foundation of Algebra is achieved, the class will move onto Geometry, specifically Euclidean geometry. The class will culminate with an overall project utilizing all concepts learned from the course.

LANGUAGE ARTS INSTRUCTION

Small Group Language Arts for Students Entering Grades 1-8

*This class will be offered in person and/or virtual.

This small group language arts class will be held for 90 minutes each day and is designed to help elementary to middle school students acquire grade level reading and writing skills in an enjoyable, supportive, informal setting of no more than 12 students. The program runs for 5 weeks and provides 29 hours of differentiated instruction over 19 days featuring online games, IXL, small group instruction, explorations and more.

Writing Workshop for Students Entering Grades 1-8

This small group literacy program is designed to help elementary students whose reading ability is stronger than their writing ability. In an enjoyable, supportive, informal setting of no more than 12 students, children will participate in 29 hours of writing workshop instruction that will focus on improving students' ability to express their thoughts in writing with clarity and confidence.

ESL Instruction

ESL: English as a Second Language for Students Entering Grades 1-6

*Only students identified for ELL services are eligible to enroll for this course.

This is a FREE program for currently identified and eligible ELL students, and it is designed to help our English Language Learners continue to improve within the four strands of language development (listening, speaking, reading, and writing). Students will use online tools, which may include Reading A-Z, LexiaCore5, multicultural stories, poems, and leveled texts. Students will meet in person to practice small group reading strategies, to answer questions, and to engage in listen and comprehension activities. A focus will also be on following directions and growing and enhancing vocabulary.

Reading, Writing, and Math, Oh My! for Students entering Grades 1-3 & 4-6

Students will maintain and further develop their skills as related to word work, reactiviting, and mathematics in this center-based community of learning. The course is designed to actively engage students throughout the morning. They will work collaboratively with peers, in small groups, and one-on-one with the teacher(s). Teachers will tap into individual interests, strengths, and needs of each child.

<u>Word Work</u> - Strategy lessons will be conducted to strengthen decoding and encoding skills.

<u>Reading</u> - Strategy lessons will be conducted to strengthen fluency and comprehension.

<u>Writing</u> - Students will work on mechanics and the development of ideas when writing.

<u>Mathematics</u> - Students will sharpen mathematical facts and problem solving skills.

Digital Art and Animation for Students Entering Grades 3-8

In this project-based literacy course, your child will work with other children across different grade levels to create short skits and performances using children's picture books. An emphasis will be placed on developing reading fluency and higher-level comprehension skills through the use of small group planning and rehearsal sessions. As a culminating activity, students will showcase their performances.

Chess Club for Students Entering Grades 3-8

Chess is a game that has been in existence for a long time and which encompasses strategy and high-level, critical thinking skills! Learning to play chess strengthens various skills include increasing and improving analytical thinking skills; improving problem solving skills; increasing self-confidence and organizational habits; and improving logic and decision making skills. Educational research has shown that chess can help lead to improvement on standardized tests for reading and mathematics. The beauty of chess as a teaching tool is that it stimulates children's minds and helps them to build these skills -- all while enjoying themselves and having fun!

Students will have the opportunity daily to read texts of interest and will learn to utilize the media center to deepen their love for literacy -- all while having fun!
