The funds will allow us to implement CDC recommendations such as three feet social distancing in classrooms, providing PPE, contact tracing efforts, testing and screening efforts, air filtration and HVAC/electrical upgrades related to and supporting proper air filtration and air flow, and cleaning and sanitizing protocols.

Smaller class sizes allows for more individual interventions to meet students needs; curricular and instructional resources are necessary to implement rigorous and supportive programs that effectively meet learning goals and objective and they are necessary to support targeted, individualized instructional needs of students; and extended learning opportunities such as beyond the school day programming and summer programming will help accommodated learning loss and accelerated learning needs. A specialized summer school bridge program will support the transition of middle school students impacted by COVID using the specialized bridge program.

We will purchase technology/software and upgrade our existing technology to able to effectively implement technology based instructional strategies.
