Dear Parent/Guardian:

As a parent/guardian, you should be aware of how your child is doing in school. Sitting down with your child to look over his/her notes, take-home folder, Google Classroom, and checking the parent portal are good ways to communicate your interest and satisfaction with your child's efforts and progress. **The online portal is your way to check your child's grades on a daily basis.** For this reason, you will not receive progress reports or paper report cards throughout the school year. Since you have full access to the parent portal, we would appreciate you contacting us with any questions or concerns regarding grades. Please do not wait for a call from us.

Homework will be posted on Google Classroom or the classroom white board. Students should record their homework in a routine location (ie: assignment pad or Google doc labeled "homework"), and review this at home each evening. This is your child's responsibility. Homework is due when assigned and will be counted as part of the marking period grade.

To guarantee your child and all students in the community the most positive educational environment, we have developed a set of community responsibilities. A copy of these responsibilities is enclosed. We ask that you review them with your child, then sign and return the attached sheet to the homeroom teacher on the first day of school. We thank you in advance for your support and cooperation in helping your child embark on this new and rewarding educational experience. We look forward to meeting you at Back to School Night.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE SCHEDULE

★ What time does school actually start and where do I go?

First period begins at 7:30 a.m. For Beta students, homeroom is in a different room from their first period class. Therefore, they should report to their homeroom each day before their first period class.

★ Who is my child's homeroom teacher?

Homeroom teachers will be indicated separately on the schedule.

Attendance and the pledge will be conducted in homeroom at 7:25 am.

School paperwork and notices will be handed out and collected here.

★ What do the letters (A-F) mean on the schedule?

MEMS operates on a modified block schedule. The days A-F each stand for a day in our six day rotation of classes. Every day your child will attend each of the core subjects (math, language arts, and science/social studies) for a block of time. All seventh graders will attend physical education on days A, C, and E. If you are confused, don't worry. Staff members will be on hand to answer any questions. In addition, each school day begins with an announcement regarding what letter day it is.

★ What is a cycle (elective) course?

There are five cycle courses. Students will be scheduled into various

courses, including World Language, over the course of the year.

★ When do I have Science or Social Studies?

Seventh and eighth grade students take science and social studies as a

half-year/semester course.

★ When do I have WIN or Physical Education?

These are alternating full year courses.WIN takes place on BDF days, while

Physical Education takes place on ACE days.
