Gamma's Expectations

Homework:

Homework is an important tool on many levels. It is a communication between student and teacher that conveys the level of understanding of lessons taught in the classroom.

- Homework provides students with a framework for organization and structure.
- It reinforces what has been covered in class, or introduces what will follow.
- Another aspect of homework is that it provides the connection between home and school.

We ask that students strive to complete their daily homework. We ask that parents support homework completion. While homework is posted on teachers' individual Google Classroom sites, each teacher's homework board in class is the primary source of homework info. You may want to purchase an agenda/planner or use a digital agenda/planner to keep track of your assignments every day!

General Rules and Policies:

- ★ Respect: Students are expected to be respectful toward teachers and peers. This extends to all building personnel such as lunch aides, secretaries, all teachers in the building, custodians, etc. Treat others as you wish to be treated. Speak politely and make eye contact when you are speaking with another person. Students will respect the property of peers, teachers, and the school at all times.
- ★ Academic Honesty: Students are expected to maintain academic honesty and complete their own work at all times. If it is recognized that a student has either copied work or cheated, he or she will be given a zero for that assignment. In addition, he or she will be given detention and a call will be made home.
- ★ Schedule: Students must adhere to their class and locker schedules when/if lockers are distributed. It is imperative that students get to classes on time. Students will also be given specific times when they are allowed to go to their lockers. Locker visits between classes are not permitted without a teacher's knowledge and consent.
- ★ ChromebookS: These are excellent tools that we will be using on a daily basis to supplement instruction. Students must follow the Acceptable Use Policy set by the district as well as individual teacher's classroom policies. Chromebooks should be FULLY CHARGED every night before returning to school the next day. Chromebooks are to be used in class with teacher permission ONLY. A Gamma Chromebook contract will be distributed following our welcome assembly.

Gamma FAQ

Q: What happens if the rules are not followed?

A: Depending upon the infraction, students may receive a warning, a parent phone call, or may be referred to administration for further consequences.

Q: What happens if I am absent?

A: It is our community policy that it is the students' responsibility to get all missed work from all teachers. Students may do so by meeting with the teachers, checking the teachers' Google Classroom, or asking a reliable classmate. If absent work is not made up in a timely fashion, it will be considered incomplete and result in a zero. The school's policy is the number of days missed should match the number of days to make up the work!

Q: What do the letters (A-F) mean on the schedule?

A: MEMS operates on a modified block schedule. The days A-F each stand for a day in our six-day rotation of classes. Every day your child will attend each of the core subjects (math, language arts, and science/social studies) for a block of time. All seventh graders will attend physical education on days A, C, and E. If you are confused, don't worry. Staff members will be on hand to answer any questions. In addition, each school day begins with an announcement regarding what letter day it is.
